MAHIKENG MAIL-RAMOTSHERE: Ramotshere Moiloa Local Municipality will on Monday officially open the Zeerust Driving Licensing Testing Centre (DLTC).

The DLTC which is located at Henryville was gutted down by fire during the community protests during March 2017. The municipality has worked tirelessly to ensure the replacement of all the valuables viz, e-Natis equipment, computers, files, furniture, etc. which were lost through fire. According to the Acting Municipal Manager, Ernest Mangope

the traffic examiners will concentrate mostly on the renewal of driving licenses and Professional Driving Permits (PDP) "We are striving to curb the backlog which occurred during the hard lockdown which was implemented on March 26 2020. There was a government gazette issued on December 3 giving the motorists whose licenses and permits expired

during that period an extension until 31st August 2021. Only those licenses which expired between March 26 2020 and December 31 2020 are liable for the extension and will be prioritized," said Mangope. All covid-19 protocols will be enforced and adhered to.

The office will only be servicing 40 people per day to alleviate the pressure and possibility of contracting covid-19. Only a limited number of people will be allowed to enter the building for required services.
